Article 16 – *Right to a fair trial*

1. In the criminal trial, everyone shall be presumed innocent until proven guilty according to law. A heavier burden of proof rests upon the prosecution than the defence.

2. No one shall be convicted of an offence unless the facts are proven by reasonable and lawful evidence and because of a final judgement given by a court in a fair and public trial.

3. Everyone charged with a criminal offence has the following minimum rights:

(a) to be informed promptly, in a language which he understands, of the nature and cause of the accusation against him;

(b) to have adequate time and facilities for the preparation of his defence;

(c) to defend himself in person or through legal assistance of his own choosing; to be informed, if he does not have legal assistance, of this right; and to have legal assistance assigned to him, free of cost, if he lacks sufficient means to pay for one;

(d) to examine or have examined witnesses against him and to obtain the attendance and examination of witnesses on his behalf under the same conditions as witnesses against him;

(e) to have the free assistance of an interpreter if he cannot understand or speak the language used in court;

(f) to trial within a reasonable time;

(g) to be tried by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law;

(h) to public hearing of the trial and judgement;

(i) to appeal to a higher instance.

Article 17 *Right to privacy*

1. Everyone has the right to a private life.

2. No one may be subjected to arbitrary interference by public authorities in his or her private and family life, home or correspondence. No one may be subjected to such attacks on his or her honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such attacks.

3. Paragraph 2 shall not prevent the lawful monitoring of communications by the competent authorities for the purpose of national defence, public security or the protection of the State.
